Legal framework for European Eel (I)

1. European Union

- Council Regulation 1100/2007 (Eel Regulation)
- Measures for the recovery of the stock of European eel
- EU Wildlife Trade Regulations
- No export and import since 2010 (EU Member States' Scientific Review Group)
- Intra-EU trade allowed
- TAC and quotas Regulations 2018 & 2019
- 3 month-closure for eel fishing



Legal framework for European Eel (II)

2. International

- CITES Appendix II (since 2009)
- Legality and sustainability of trade
- CMS Appendix II (since 2014)
- International cooperation
- GFCM Recommendation GFCM/42/2018/1
- Management measures for European eel in the Mediterranean, incl. eel management plans & fishing closure



Eel Regulation (I)

 \rightarrow For the recovery of the stock of European eel

→ Applies at sea, in transitional and fresh waters

Requirements for the EU Member States

- Establishing Eel Management Plans (EMPs)
- Achieving 40% escapement of silver eel (compared to pristine)
- Reserving 60% of glass eel catches for restocking
- Reducing 50% effort or catches in EU marine waters compared to 2004-2006 average



Eel Regulation (II)

Content of the Eel Management Plans

- Fishing effort reduction (commercial and recreational)
- Reducing catches in EU marine waters
- Restocking measures
- Restoring river continuity (hydropower turbines and dams)
- Combatting predators
- Measures relating to aquaculture
- Implementing other measures to achieve the objectives



Eel Regulation (III)

Reporting obligations

- % of biomass of silver eel escaping to the sea
- Level of fishing effort and % effort
- Mortality caused by non-fisheries factors and % reduction
- Glass eel catches and % used for consumption, aquaculture, restocking

Evaluation/Revision

- EMPs may be revised in line with new scientific information
- Eel Regulation currently evaluated



Additional EU actions for the recovery of European eel (I)

- Annual ICES advice on the state of the stock and ad hoc requests to the Commission
- > Recent actions to reinforce the protection of eels:
 - **o** three-month closure of eel fisheries at EU level
 - political commitment from COM and MS to improve the implementation of the Eel Regulation ('Declaration on eels', December 2017)
 - $\circ~$ formal evaluation of the Eel Regulation
 - from 2019, eel fisheries in the scope of Specific Control and Inspection Programme (SCIP) under the EU Control Regulation, supporting involvement of the European Fisheries Control Agency (EFCA)



Additional EU actions for the recovery of European eel (II)

> Work with international partners:

- With the Russian Federation (Joint Baltic Sea Fisheries Committee)
- With third countries through Regional Fisheries Management Organisations, e.g. General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM)

to ensure a comprehensive and coordinated approach to the recovery of the stock among all stakeholders.



Evaluation of the Eel Regulation – Purpose and scope

- ✓ Launched in 2018, currently at final stage
- ✓ To assess the measures for the recovery of European eel stock and their contribution to the achievement of the Regulation's objectives
- ✓ Covers: management, implementation, enforcement issues, use of EU funds for stocking, linkages with other EU rules and international instruments, incl. CITES and CMS
- ✓ To inform whether Eel Regulation needs to be reviewed and/or the implementation needs to be improved
